

EMPLOYING PHYSICALLY DISABLED WORKERS

In 2015, the group of volunteers who visited the project, taught the 4 participants with physical disabilities how to do bead embroidery, general beadwork and how to use a sewing machine.



When Susie first met the group in October, 2014, they couldn't find employment, because of the stigma attached to having a disability in Peru. Some of them were unable to get out of the house for months at a time and were depressed, isolated, and in despair.

Since receiving training and employment from CAI, they are now earning a wage to support themselves, which also means they can now pay for taxis, so that they can leave the house. Their families view them differently and they are finally able to use their gifts.



They are highly talented young people and are producing, excellent, high quality products. These 4 are outworkers. They came to the church once a week for the first 4 weeks, and now come fortnightly.
